Course Description

“Discover how occlusion, vertical dimension, and composite technique work together to create predictable, minimally invasive smile transformations.”

Creating natural-looking composite restorations that are both functional and predictable remains one of dentistry’s biggest challenges. This course presents a conservative, step-by-step approach that can be immediately applied in practice. Special emphasis is placed on the critical relationship between occlusion, vertical dimension, and composite longevity. This program combines innovative, conservative composite techniques with practical clinical workflows to deliver exceptional esthetics and long-term function. Participants will learn how to make both minor and major changes—from individual tooth enhancements to opening vertical dimension and managing complex wear cases—so function is comfortable, restorations are durable, and smiles look natural. Patients appreciate options that require little or no preparation—even in challenging cases—so teeth don’t have to be “drilled down” to achieve excellent results. Unlike many resin courses that focus primarily on layering, this program integrates occlusal principles, diagnostic decision-making, material selection, and patient communication strategies. The result is greater clinical confidence, improved case acceptance, and more predictable outcomes.
